It looks as if Larry was to blame. There are wine bottles in his room, and he needed the money urgently.

But Andrew Ambitious kidnapped the horse-with Sam's help. Sam alone is not clever enough to carry out such a plan alone, and someone has to look after Princess while Andrew is in the race on Phoenix. Andrew paid him 500\$ which he needs to pay off his car, so he put narcotics into Larry's water bottle. Thus, Larry fell asleep and Andrew and Sam could kidnap Princess. The wine bottles are a red herring to make Andrew look guilty. Andrew couldn't have started on Phoenix if Princess hadn't been kidnapped. And Andrew needs the money to pay his debts at the Casino.

The hospital bill proves that Larry didn't lie about his mother's illness. Charlie confirms that Larry never drinks alcohol.
